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# NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

Request to Amend the Zoning By-law Application Number: 24 164540 NNY 16 OZ

#### **PROPOSAL**

The application to amend the Zoning By-law proposes to permit the construction of a three-storey low-rise stacked townhouse apartment building consisting of 21 residential units. The building is proposed to have 1,183.4 square metres of total Gross Floor Area, resulting in a density of 0.98 times the area of the site located at 1 Broadlands Boulevard. The application proposes to include 603.28 square metre outdoor amenity area. Vehicular ingress and egress to the site is to be provided by a driveway via Broadlands Boulevard.

Parking is proposed to be in rear of the property at surface level and is proposed to provide 10 vehicular parking which includes three visitor parking and 18 bicycle parking spaces.



If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment you must make a written request to the City Clerk attention: Matthew Green, Administrator, North York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out above.

**Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal:** If a specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered



owner of any land to which by-law would apply would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the by-law would apply does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed, the specified person or public body as defined under the Planning Act or the registered owner of any land to which the by-law would apply is not entitled to appeal the by-law.

**People writing or making presentations at the public meeting:** The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations, or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
